From SR 64 in Ona, turn south at the caution light onto CR 663. Travel 5 miles on 663 and turn right onto Goose Pond Road.
*Travel 1.5 miles and turn left onto
Experiment Station Road. Travel about a mile to reach the Range Cattle REC facilities.

From Arcadia -

Travel west on SR 70 to CR 661. Take a right on CR 661 and travel about 12 miles to Goose Pond Road. Take a left on Goose Pond Road (see Ona instructions at *).

From Bradenton -

From the junction of I-75 and SR 64 travel east to CR 665, turn right. Travel to Goose Pond Road and turn left. Go to Experiment Station Road and turn right. Travel about a mile to reach the Center.
